But for a long time, only some people in America had freedom. That was a really big mistake that hurt a lot of people.

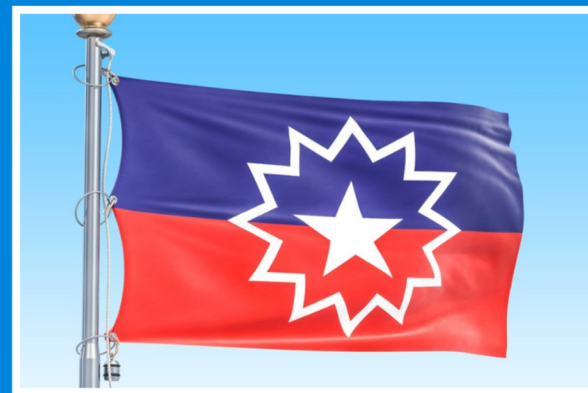
We feel sad when we or someone else is hurt.
